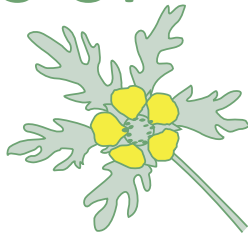

English Elm	<i>Ulmus procera</i>	lime green winged fruit (samaras)
Wych Elm	<i>Ulmus glabra</i>	lime green winged fruit (samaras)
Norway Maple	<i>Acer platanoids</i>	bright lime-green flowers
Sycamore	<i>Acer pseudoplatanoides</i>	pendulous tassels
